CODE OF PRACTICES & PROCEDURES FOR FAIR DISCLOSURE OF UNPUBLISHED PRICE SENSITIVE INFORMATION

I. PREAMBLE

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015, (hereinafter referred to as the 'Regulations') mandates the listed Companies to frame a Code of Practices and Procedures for fair and timely dissemination of unpublished price sensitive information. Accordingly, Code of Practices & Procedures for Fair Disclosure of Unpublished Price Sensitive Information has been approved and implemented by the Board of Directors of the Company.

II. APPLICABILITY

The Code of Practices & Procedures for Fair Disclosure of Unpublished Price Sensitive Information is applicable w.e.f February 3, 2016, as amended from time to time.

III. CODE

1.1 Prompt Disclosure of Price Sensitive Information

Price Sensitive Information shall be disclosed to the Stock Exchanges and disseminated promptly on a continuous basis as soon as credible and concrete information comes into being in order to make such information generally available. For this purpose Price Sensitive Information means any information which relates directly or indirectly to the Company and which, if published is likely to affect the price discovery of shares of the Company. The following shall be deemed to be Price Sensitive Information:

- (i) financial results;
- (ii) dividends;
- (iii) change in capital structure
- (iv) mergers, de-mergers, acquisitions, delistings, disposals and expansion of business, ¹[award or termination of order/contracts not in the normal course of business] and such other transactions;
- (v) changes in Key Managerial Personnel ¹[, other than due to superannuation or end of term, and resignation of a Statutory Auditor or Secretarial Auditor;]
- (vi) ¹[change in rating(s), other than ESG rating(s);
- (vii) fund raising proposed to be undertaken;
- (viii) agreements, by whatever name called, which may impact the management or control of the company;
- (ix) fraud or defaults by the company, its promoter, director, key managerial personnel, or subsidiary or arrest of key managerial personnel, promoter or director of the company, whether occurred within India or abroad;
- (x) resolution plan/ restructuring or one-time settlement in relation to loans/borrowings from banks/financial institutions;
- (xi) admission of winding-up petition filed by any party /creditors and admission of application by the Tribunal filed by the corporate applicant or financial creditors for initiation of corporate insolvency resolution process against the

company as a corporate debtor, approval of resolution plan or rejection thereof under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016;

- (xii) initiation of forensic audit, by whatever name called, by the company or any other entity for detecting mis-statement in financials, misappropriation/ siphoning or diversion of funds and receipt of final forensic audit report;
- (xiii) action(s) initiated or orders passed within India or abroad, by any regulatory, statutory, enforcement authority or judicial body against the company or its directors, key managerial personnel, promoter or subsidiary, in relation to the company;
- (xiv) outcome of any litigation(s) or dispute(s) which may have an impact on the company;
- (xv) giving of guarantees or indemnity or becoming a surety, by whatever named called, for any third party, by the company not in the normal course of business;
- (xvi) granting, withdrawal, surrender, cancellation or suspension of key licenses or regulatory approvals.

Explanation 1- For the purpose of sub-clause (ix):

- a. 'Fraud' shall have the same meaning as referred to in Regulation 2(1)(c) of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Fraudulent and Unfair Trade Practices relating to Securities Market) Regulations, 2003.
- b. 'Default' shall have the same meaning as referred to in Clause 6 of paragraph A of Part A of Schedule III of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

Explanation 2- For identification of events enumerated in this clause as unpublished price sensitive information, the guidelines for materiality referred at paragraph A of Part A of Schedule III of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as may be specified by the Board from time to time and materiality as referred at paragraph B of Part A of Schedule III of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 shall be applicable.]]

- (xvii) Other matters as may be prescribed by SEBI/considered by the Compliance Officer to be price sensitive from time to time.

1.2 Uniform and Universal dissemination of Unpublished Price Sensitive Information

The price sensitive information shall be disseminated uniformly and universally to all stakeholders through Stock Exchanges and/ or by posting the same on official website of the Company i.e. www.tridentindia.com. The Company shall use its best endeavours to avoid selective disclosure of price sensitive information. However, if any Information gets disclosed selectively or inadvertently or otherwise, endeavour shall be made to make generally available the above information through dissemination of the same to Stock Exchanges and/or by posting the same on the official website of the Company as soon as practicable.

1.3 Procedures for responding to any Queries on news reports and/or requests for verification of market rumors by regulatory authorities

- i. Appropriate, fair & prompt response shall be submitted to all queries on news reports or requests for verification of market rumors received from regulatory authorities.
- ii. Such replies shall be signed by the Compliance Officer(s)/ Managing Director/ Whole- time Director. In their absence, such replies shall be signed by such other officer/ person as may have been authorized.
- iii. In case the query/request has been received from a Stock Exchange, a copy of such reply shall be sent to other stock exchange(s) also where shares of the Company are listed.
- iv. The Compliance Officer(s) shall oversee corporate disclosure. He shall be responsible for deciding whether a public announcement is necessary for verifying or denying rumours and then making the disclosure.

1.4 Procedure for Disclosure/ dissemination of Price Sensitive Information with special reference to Analysts, Institutional Investors etc.

- i. Only Public information will be provided to Analysts/Research person and Institutional Investors. Alternatively any unpublished price sensitive information given to Analysts/Research Person should be simultaneously made public at the earliest.
- ii. In order to avoid mis-quoting or mis-representing it is desirable that two Company representatives be present at the meeting with Analysts and Institutional Investors and the discussion should be recorded and transcripts should be made and disseminated on the official website of the Company.
- iii. Extra caution will be taken while dealing with analysts' questions that raise issue outside the intended scope of discussion. Unanticipated questions will be taken on notice and a considered response shall be furnished later. If the answer includes price sensitive information, a public announcement should be made before responding.

1.5 Need to Know

Unpublished Price Sensitive Information shall be handled on a “need to know” basis

i.e. Unpublished Price Sensitive Information shall be disclosed only to those within the Company who need the information to discharge their official duties or discharge of legal obligations.

1.6 Sharing of Unpublished Price Sensitive Information for Legitimate Purpose.

- i. For the purpose of sharing of any Unpublished Price Sensitive Information, it has to be ensured that it is for legitimate purpose only. “Legitimate Purpose” shall include sharing of unpublished price sensitive information in the ordinary course of business by an insider with partners, collaborators, lenders, customers, suppliers, merchant bankers, legal advisors, auditors, insolvency professionals or other advisors or consultants, provided that such sharing has not been carried out to evade or circumvent the prohibitions of these regulations.
- ii. Any person in receipt of unpublished price sensitive information pursuant to “legitimate purpose” shall be considered an “insider” for purposes of these regulations and due notice shall be given to such persons to maintain confidentiality of such UPSI in compliance with these regulations.

1.7 Monitoring and Co-ordinating dissemination of disclosures

The Compliance Officer shall act as Chief Investor Relations Officer, to deal with prompt dissemination of information and disclosure of unpublished price sensitive information to make the same generally available.

IV. DISCLOSURES

This Code and any amendment thereof will be published on the Company’s official website (www.tridentindia.com) and shall be promptly intimated to the Stock Exchange(s) where the securities of the Company are listed.
